Safety is priority; you'll learn some basic safety skills and have the opportunity to become safety certified before the weekend is over! Remember, you must be safety certified with each horse you plan to bring to the Fair. If you have a new horse or this is your first year, you will need to pass Safety I & II if you plan to ride your horse at the Fair. This is a requirement. Safety I allows you to show from the ground at the Fair; Safety II qualifies you to ride at the Fair.

Please note: if you've passed Safety I & II previously with the horse, you will not need to retest. But it's always important to brush up on those safety skills. If you are unable to attend camp, you may safety test at a future clinic prior to the Fair.

What you'll need to bring:

Riding boots and helmet, if you are bringing your horse
A jacketit might be cold
Your horse for clinics
Original plus one copy of your negative Coggins test is required
A great attitude!!

Once again this year, in order to provide the best learning opportunity for everyone, all participants must be accompanied by an adult age 21 or older. Parents are welcome to attend any and all sessions. Tying to trailers is permissible for this event.
