Extension Office update and report:

- Nebraska Fundraiser Update: There were about 45 participants in the bowling event, raising approximately \$100, added to individual donations brings the total to \$500. There are still a few clubs who want to make donations yet.
- Officer, Photography, Communications Workshops Update:
