No RSVP required for these courses.

Attention new and returning 4-H volunteers! In order to be or continue to be a Wisconsin state-certified 4-H volunteer, you must complete the following requirements:

- Create or re-enroll your 4HOnline profile
- Pass a state background check through the state system (initial & every 4 years after that)
- Attend V.I.P. training at the Extension office (onetime)
- Complete Mandated Reporter training in your 4HOnline profile (one-time)

We still have volunteers that need to complete the re-enrollment process. If you have questions about where you are in the process, or simply wish to verify that you are all set to go, please reach out to the Extension office today. Letters will be mailed to pending volunteers who still have requirements to fill early in the new year.

What is it?

Come join us for the day and learn something new! 4-H and community members (non 4-H members) can attend different class sessions to explore various project areas and complete hands-on, educational activities taught by volunteer leaders and teachers. This year's event will be held on **Saturday, February 15th** at Bangor Elementary School (701 14th Ave S) in Bangor.

To be part of this popular annual event, simply read through each class description, fill out the registration form on page 8 (one per youth, please!) and turn it in with your fee to the Extension office by **Thursday**, **January 30th** at **4:30 p.m**. AEROSPACE - Youth will be able to experiment with whirligigs, balsa planes and a landing strip. Participants will be able to build and launch fizzy rockets. We will discuss the forces and motion principles of different aircraft.

Grades 3 & up ~ Class limit 15 ~ \$0 Fee

AWESOME ADVENTURES DNA-

Through hands-on activities and short videos, we will explore the wonders of DNA. Learn how DNA matches base pairs by making a candy DNA helix and beaded DNA bracelets, then see how it twists with an origami DNA model and try your hand at matching chromosomes into pairs. Discover DNA through these awesome adventures and more!

Grades K-2 ∼ Class limit 10 ∼ \$0 Fee

BEGINNING SHOOTING SPORTS - Hands on experience with archery and pellet gun, with an emphasis on safety. This class is intended as an introduction to the sport for youth that have little to no experience with archery or pellet gun. All equipment is provided.

Grades 2 & up ~ Class limit 10 ~ \$0 Fee

CERAMICS - In this ceramics class, youth will learn a variety of techniques! Please dress appropriately. **Youth will need to bring a shoebox and an old towel as well.** Participants will paint a ceramic figurine of their choice to take home. Additional larger pieces will be provided at additional cost (up to \$15 extra). Please bring additional money if you'd like something larger.

CREATIVE CRAFTS WITH PONY BEADS - Using pony beads, you will create fun keychains to hang on whatever you please.

DOING DNA: THE CODE OF LIFE - Explore how DNA is a lot like an alphabet. Test a sample of highly-purified DNA from fish. Experiment with extracting DNA from wheat germ. Build a "DNA Bracelet" - a model of single-stranded DNA you can take home

Grades 3 & up ~ Class limit 25 ~ \$0 fee

DRAWING SUPER HEROES AND VILLIANS - Learn to draw a superhero character! Add capes, cowls, gloves, boots and masks of your own designs. We will provide drawing materials, but bring your preferred coloring medium (colored pencils, markers, watercolors, etc). You will go home with a drawing on high-quality art paper, as well as professional drawing supplies.

ELECTRONICS: BUILD A CAR! - We'll learn about circuits and components (batteries, LED's, motors, resistors, etc) and then build a car. All classes are done without soldering.

GIVING BLANKETS - La Crosse Home and Community Education (LAHCE) members will guide youth on how to cut and tie fleece blankets. All blankets created will be donated to the Family and Children's Center in La Crosse.

HANDS UP FOR SIGN LANGUAGE - Put your hands up and learn to sign the alphabet and some common phrases through "hands on" activities.

IMPROVE YOUR PHOTOGRAPHY SKILLS - Tips to make your photos better. Fair entries and categories explained. Bring your camera (and its manual) for some hands on activities. You be the judge!

IRISH FOLK DANCING - Ceili (pronounced Kay-leigh) Dancing is a popular folk dance that hails from Ireland. In the class you will learn a few basic steps, then put it all together to a few songs. No prior experience needed!
