2020 YQCA Training

For youth exhibitors that wish to participate in the 2020 Wisconsin State Fair, Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) training is required. This training is also required for the 2020 La Crosse Interstate Fair, but for swine exhibitors only.

There are 3 different ways to complete your YQCA training this year (see below).

ONLINE:

YQCA training can be taken online in the form of self-guided modules. The cost for this format is \$12 per youth. To get this off your to-do list - visit http://yqca.learngrow.io/Account/Login and enter your 4HOnline profile information. Module content varies based on youth's current school grade. Modules do not have to be completed in a single sitting. Upon completion of training, an online certificate will be generated which will have a certificate number on it which is needed for fair entries. It is recommended that these e-certificates be printed for records.

FACE TO FACE:

Kaitlyn Lance, Agriculture Educator, and Emily Crook, Positive Youth Development Educator, will be offering face-to-face trainings on Tuesday, March 10, 2020 and Tuesday, April 7, 2020 from 5:00 - 6:30 p.m. at Bangor High School (700 10th Ave S, Bangor, WI 54614). Pre-registration for these events is required via the YQCA website and is available now! The cost for this format is \$3 per youth, but will be reimbursed by the 4-H Leaders Association if a digital or paper copy of the online invoice/receipt is presented to the Extension office. Payment for training is due online upon registration. Register here: http://yqca.learngrow.io/Account/Login

TEST OUT:

The new "test out" option will be available for the first time this year only for youth ages 12, 15, 19 years old who feel they have sufficient knowledge of the YQCA training content. Youth will only have 1 chance to pass a 50 question exam at 80% or better. Upon passing, certification will be good for 3 years until they age into the next age bracket of material. Since this option is good for 3 year's worth of modules, it costs \$36 per youth. However, you will not be charged if youth do not pass with an 80% or better. Currently there are no study materials for this option.

Expressive Arts Festival

When: Saturday, March 14th from 9:00 a.m. to approximately noon (dependent on number of participants).

Where: West Salem Elementary School, 475 N Mark St, West Salem, WI 54669

Cost: Participation in this event is free and participants can be of any age. We are still in the process of adding a number of options to the drama performances for future festivals, but this year's options will remain the same as last years.

Changes to note for 2020: there is no minimum number of participants required for any music performances. Literary readings do not require a sheet for the judge to follow along.

We would love for youth to get comfortable being expressive, not perfect!

General Rules & Guidelines

All Categories:

- No hay, straw, cornstalks, shavings, sawdust, confetti, or like substance may be used in any performance.
- Presentations must be family friendly and appropriate.

Drama:

- All groups must consist of 3 or more participants regardless of category.
- Youth may participate in only 1 performance per category.
- Performances can not have been prepared or presented in any other competitive event.
- Groups are allowed 5 minutes apiece for set up and take down of their stage in addition to the maximum time limit of their category.

Speaking:

 Youth may only participate in 2 speaking performances regardless of category.

Demonstration:

- Youth may participate in only 1 performance per category.
- The maximum time limit in all categories is 15 minutes.

Music:

- Groups must consist of 3 or more participants regardless of category.
- The maximum time limit in all categories is 12 minutes. Participants may utilize no more than 3 minutes each for set up and take down.
- No directing is permitted from the audience or in front of the stage.

Arts & Crafts

- All entries must have a 3" X 5" index card listing title
 of piece, artist name, club, grade, date completed,
 and brief description of materials used attached
 securely somewhere to the piece.
- Participants may only enter 5 exhibits.
- No woodworking entries are permitted.
- Note: to submit an item for the La Crosse Interstate Fair, you may be restricted to 24" x 24" size. This is not a requirement for Expressive Arts.

Marketing

- All entries must have a 3" X 5" index card listing title
 of piece, artist name, club, grade, date completed,
 and brief description of materials used attached
 securely somewhere to the piece.
- Any item is acceptable that can be used for promotion of 4-H. All entries must have at least one 4-H logo.

Photography

- All entries must have a 3" X 5" index card listing title
 of piece, artist name, club, grade, date completed,
 and brief description of materials used attached
 securely somewhere to the piece.
- Participants may only enter 5 exhibits.
- The maximum size of entries to be eligible for entry to the La Crosse Interstate Fair is 5" X 7" and mounted on poster board of any color no larger than 6" X 8".
- Photos must be participant's own original work.
