
## bits n' pieces >>>

# charters >>

The state 4-H program has updated the Charter and Financial reporting process for 2020-2021 year. All clubs hoping to be 4-H clubs, must submit an annual charter. The 4-H Charter indicates that a 4-H Club or Group is organized in accordance with the objectives of the Wisconsin 4-H program. The University of Wisconsin-Madison, Division of Extension grants 4-H Charters which formally authorizes a Wisconsin 4-H Club or Group to use the 4-H Name and Emblem for educational purposes in accordance with laws and regulations established by Congress and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. In addition, the 4-H Charter Application provides:

- Documentation of educational activities of the 4-H Club or Group/Committee needed for liability coverage for 4-H volunteers and members
- Program impact evaluation and educational planning
- Documentation of compliance by 4-H Clubs and Groups with EEO, ADA guidelines, and Civil Rights laws.
- **Wisconsin 4-H Clubs and Groups Charter Application is to be completed online by October 1st.**

This year all charters will be completed online, if you need a paper copy, please reach out to the extension office. # 2021 4-H STEM Challenge

Designed by Clemson University, the 2021 4-H STEM Challenge, Galactic Quest, focuses on the mysteries and adventures of space exploration.

Galactic Quest explores the history of humans in space, the technology and resources needed for missions, and the obstacles humans encounter in orbit. Activities explore important STEM topics ranging from physics and engineering to computer science and space agriculture. Kids learn foundational STEM skills while they wrestle with the same questions as today's top aerospace scientists and engineers! Activities can be done all at once or individually, making it great for classrooms, afterschool programs, clubs, parents and more.

#### **Astro Adventure**

- This unplugged board game promotes teamwork as kids gather the resources needed to live and work in deep space.

#### **Stellar Optics**

- In this offline activity, kids build a telescope and learn about physics and light and how telescopes have been used to explore space.

#### **Cosmic Claw**

- Kids work hands-on to engineer a mechanical arm that works to harvest crops in space.

#### **Cyber Satellite**

- In this computer science activity, kids learn about cyber security and decoding to stay safe from obstacles in orbit.

**Below are a few ways to ensure young people everywhere can participate in the 2021 STEM Challenge:**

- **Educator Kit:** Includes material for 12 youth to participate in the offline activities at the same time. Kits can be used in spaces where physical distancing can be followed. The Extension Office will purchase kits for any club wanting to participate, just notify Emily at [emily.crook@wisc.edu](mailto:emily.crook@wisc.edu).
- **Family Sized Kit:** Includes materials for 1-4 youth to participate in the offline activities at the same time from inside the home.

### PROJECTS

A project is simply a topic area that sparks a youth's interest! Projects can be offered at a club or group setting, or on your own outside of the club.

4-H members are encouraged to enroll in only one or two projects for their first year. 4-H members in 3rd grade and higher are eligible to sign up for any 4-H project.

A special project area is specifically for grades K-2, known as Cloverbuds. It is intended to be more developmentally appropriate for our youngest members.

### AT THE MEETING

Each county's 4-H program differs in how project learning opportunities are offered. Some programs offer countywide, short-term workshops. Others may have countywide programs with set dates and meeting locations. Some 4-H clubs may have adults specifically devoted to certain project areas.

In La Crosse County the following projects have chartered groups that provide educational meetings and workshops: Shooting Sports, Dogs, Goats, Rabbits, Horses, Youth Leadership.

### COUNTY COMMUNICATIONS

Emails will go out to all members currently enrolled in 4-H helping them find the literature that is available to them to assist with individual education on their projects.

New families will also get the Project installment of the New Family Newsletter. Next month is a deep dive into club meetings.


# National 4H Week
