Citizen Washington Focus Trip 2023

- Cost is approximately \$1,750 La Crosse Leaders' Association has scholarships to cover up to 75% depending on how many attend
- For this event, the Leaders' Association will interview candidates for scholarship.

The invitation hasn't gone out yet, but it will soon! Citizenship Washington Focus, or CWF for short, is the premier week long 4-H citizenship and leadership experience. CWF brings 4-H delegations from all over the country to stay in Washington D.C., our Nation's Capital! Participants learn about the roles of Senators and Representatives in the United States' government and how these parts work together to form an effective Congress. Additionally, youth get to see and experience government in action by meeting with their State's members of Congress and watching a House of Representatives meeting. Delegates will also get the opportunity to tour our Nation's Capital and experience the culture that comes with it. After completing the CWF program, they will have stronger knowledge about being an active citizen and our Government. They will also have the opportunity to discover new skills and be exposed to different perspectives and cultures from around the U.S. On top of all this, it gives delegates another opportunity to bond and network with other 4-Hers from Wisconsin and beyond.

Anyone planning on auctioning swine must complete the 2023 Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) training. It's a national multi-species quality assurance program for youth ages 8 to 21 with a focus on three core pillars: food safety, animal well-being, and character development. Every year the course is a little different, but it is solid quality education from some serious organizations. A special note: this is only for youth who plan to participate with swine in the auction.

Online training: Costs \$12 and is available right at this very moment https://yqcaprogram.org. You can take the training or do a test-out for certification. The La Crosse 4-H Leader's Association will reimburse \$3/youth when they receive a of the completion certificate. When you complete your training online, YOU need to save a copy of your certification and email it to lacrosseyouthlivestock@gmail.com (and if you request reimbursement, please email it to lacrossecounty4h@lacrossecounty.org as well).

For now, please continue to utilize your reimbursement system (leader purchases on credit card, gets reimbursed from club), and know that I'll be pushing for this approval at the state level. Here is the policy right now.

experiential learning This month we talk a little bit about the theories involved in 4-H education. There are a few of them: Essential Elements, Thriving Model, but what drives a lot of it home is the Experiential Model. 4-H is all about learning and failing, and learning again through experience. As a 4-H family, everyone has a role in this experience. Maybe one kid does the project, and another one asks him about it, and then a parent wonders out loud what could be done differently - THAT'S how we get the whole family involved. And maybe from the conversation we all get really excited to try it again when we get home!

at the meetings Sometimes meetings can be absolutely inspiring, and sometimes.. well, we can't all win all the time. On those less than fun meeting days, it's still a good opportunity to play detective and ask how it went, what they liked, didn't like, and what they would do differently. Treat the interests, the meetings, the experiences like science projects and work to see what change you can bring to it, or how to make the situation better. Meetings in general should be applying this Do - Reflect - Apply principle as well, but I do tend to place a lot of responsibility on my volunteers, so I know they are doing the best they can. See if you can spot ways they incorporate this in their programming too!
