La Crosse County 4-H Update

A huge thank you to Josie for all the work she's done to get to know our 4-H program, the volunteers, members, and our office so fast! Then to turn it around do an evaluation. Such a big undertaking. I hear that she loved to work with us this semester, so hoping she gets a job in Extension across the state. Good Luck Josie and I hope to be your colleague!

With that – I need to share some results. First and foremost – our membership is up this year – to 507 members! We retained 84.7% of our members from last year, which is above the state's 79%. The projects with the most members are: Arts, Food Preservation, Photography and Drawing. The biggest two clubs are St. Joe's Ridge Runners and Union Mills, and our smallest clubs are Pleasant Valley and Mormon Coulee. Great fits for so many!

We had a 38% response rate to our surveys counting possible youth and one parent from each family – that is PHENOMENAL. THANK YOU! The biggest interests we've had from our surveys are: FAIR! (by far the biggest interest); both learning about and learning how to care for Animals (from pets to livestock), Legos, Arts and Crafts, Leadership and Service. Our clubs and groups received a general approval rating of 85%.

We have so many ideas submitted and ways to tweak things, I'm so thrilled. I will follow up with those who indicated they wanted to chat soon, and really excited about the things we'll implement in 2023-2024!

CATEGORIES

- CLOVERBUDS (grades K-2) will make a simple snack.
- EXPLORERS (grades 3-4 or 1st year 4-Hers in 5th grade) that are NOT in a Foods & Nutrition project will prepare an after-school snack.
- **FOODS & NUTRITION** will select only ONE of the foods you have enjoyed preparing in your project. The food you select must be related to your project, but the recipe does not have to be one from the project book. You will also plan a menu that includes the food you have selected.
- **CAKE DECORATING** members will bring a decorated cake (no cupcakes) using frosting techniques and may include edible or non-edible decorations.

Rules & Information

- All entries must be ready for judging at the assigned time.
- Exhibitors must bring their own card table for displaying the place setting and food.
 You are responsible for setting up your own table and display. A separate table must be brought for each entry, not just one per exhibitor.
- All displays must include all dishes and silverware needed for the exhibit, including serving utensils for cakes. A tablecloth or placemat should be included.
- A centerpiece is recommended for everyone except cake decorators.
- Dress appropriately for the meal and occasion you are presenting.
- Include your recipe on an index card.
- You will be judged on your answers regarding age-appropriate knowledge of the My Plate dietary guidelines, food preparation, and nutritional value of the food, as well as your selection and the appearance of the table setting and food display.
- The food will not be eaten by a judge, so its temperature does not matter.

new family section Each month we hope to provide some helpful hints, definitions, and to-dos to assist new families in joining in on club and county activities. If you haven't been invited to a club meeting yet, please reach out to our office at lacrossecounty.org.

This month we learn a little more about the county fair. Each county (there are 72 in WI-4-H!) does things a little differently. Though the fair is not actually a 4-H event, it belongs to the AG Society here in La Crosse, who reports to the DATCP (https://datcp.wi.gov/). We as 4-Hers LOVE participating in it because it's a super fun way to show the mastery of all the skills we've developed throughout the year. Other youth groups participate in it too, and it's a way for 4-H members to meet those in Scouting, FFA, and other organizations. It's not a required activity in 4-H, but it is definitely a fun one. For new 4-H families, I always recommend trying an exhibit, but keeping expectations low. Just attending the fair, and witnessing judging or watching the process is an education. There are many tips and tricks on how to do the best exhibit and no one person knows it all. So show up, ask questions and prepare to be amazed!

at the meetings Most clubs will start having more fair specific meetings right about now, gearing everyone up to get their exhibits ready and helping families navigate the exhibit entry process. You will have many many questions about all of this, please do not hesitate to reach out to our office, your club leader, or the superintendent of the projects you are interested in. Also - take note of what other youth are planning for their exhibits! I know of some kids who submitted 47 exhibits. That's a bit intense! But with the right organizational skills, you can pull it off!

County There are some pre-fair events that we host - like Foods and Clothing Revue - that are specifically before the fair so we have time to give them the judging they need. Even if you don't have an exhibit for these, please come to see what they are all about. People are always willing to answer questions and show off their exhibits! Also, try to come to our 4-H tailgate this year. It's still a new, and hopefully annual, event, designed to help 4-H families network more with fair prep and other things. It's on June 23, please come!
