1. Spread each piece of bread with butter all the way to the edges
2. Add a layer of sprinkles on top of your bread

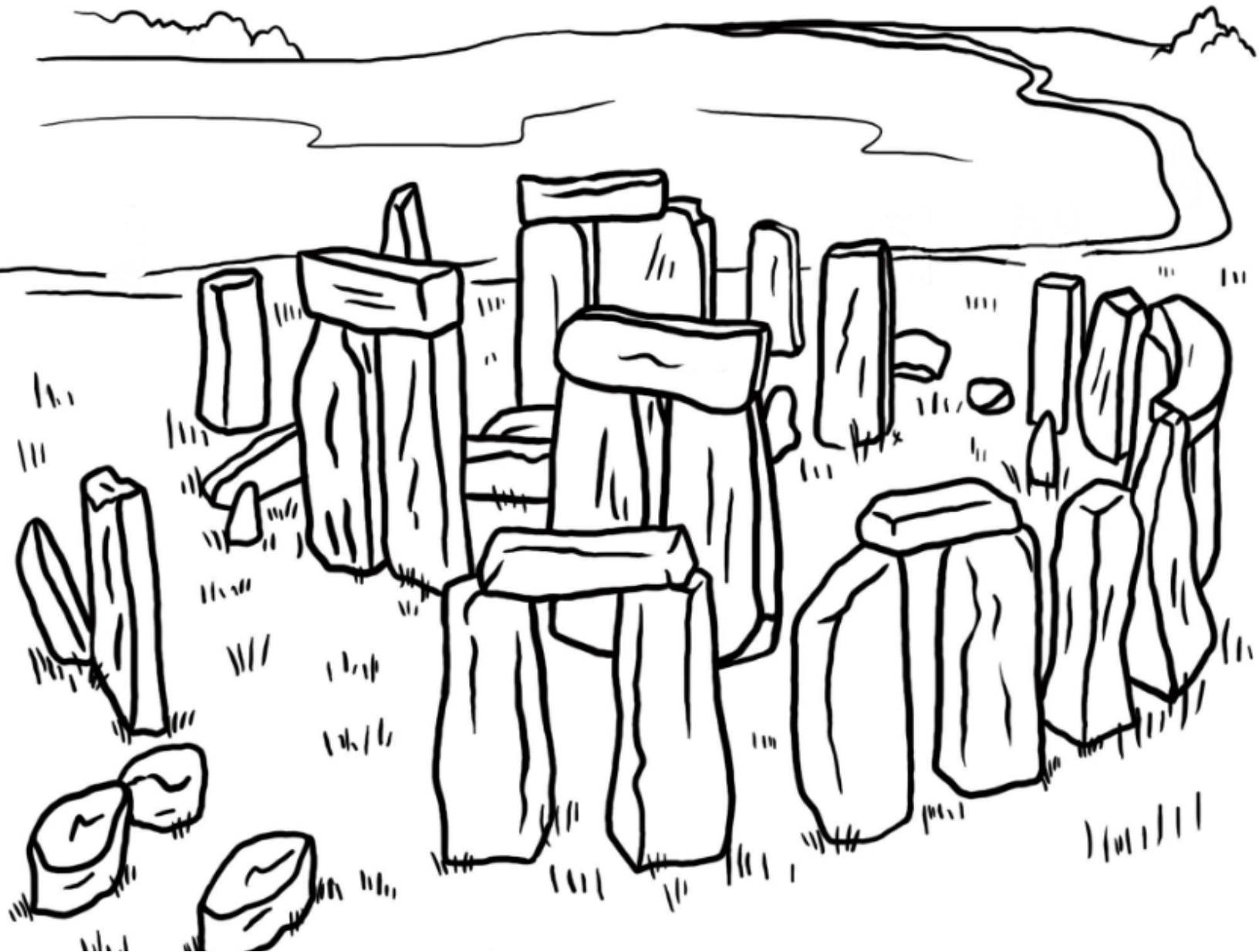

# STONEHENGE

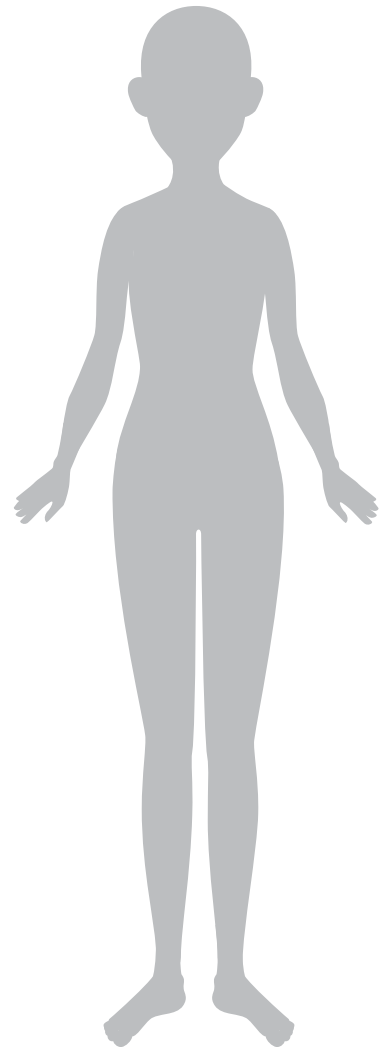
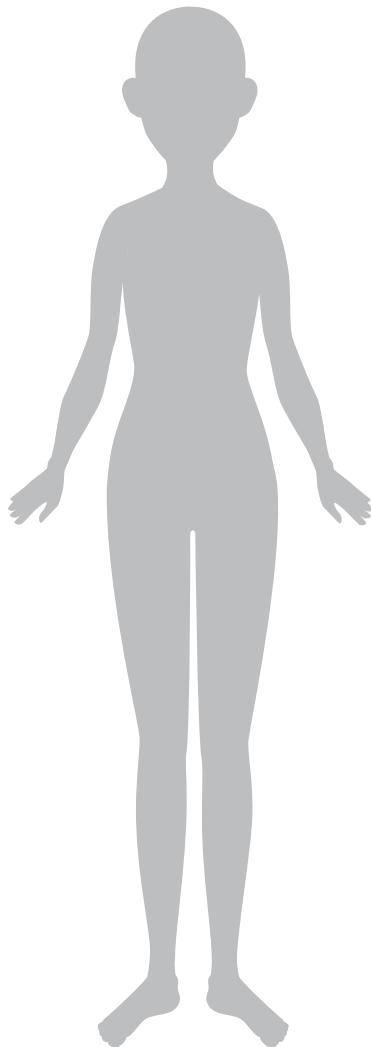
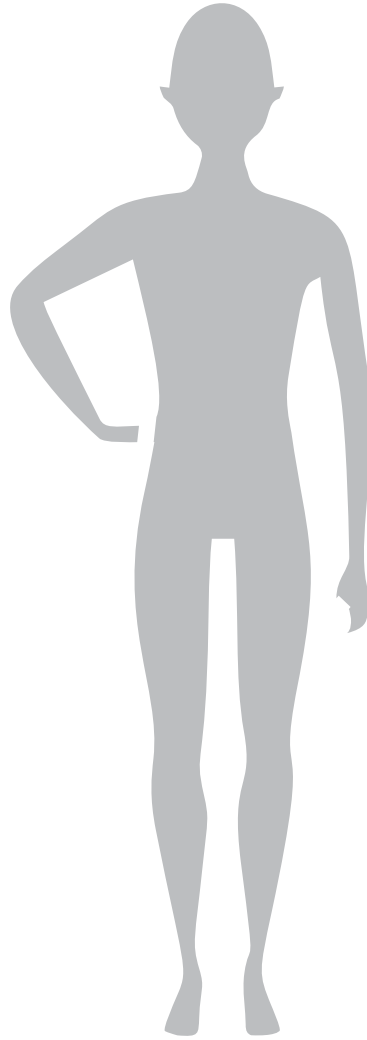
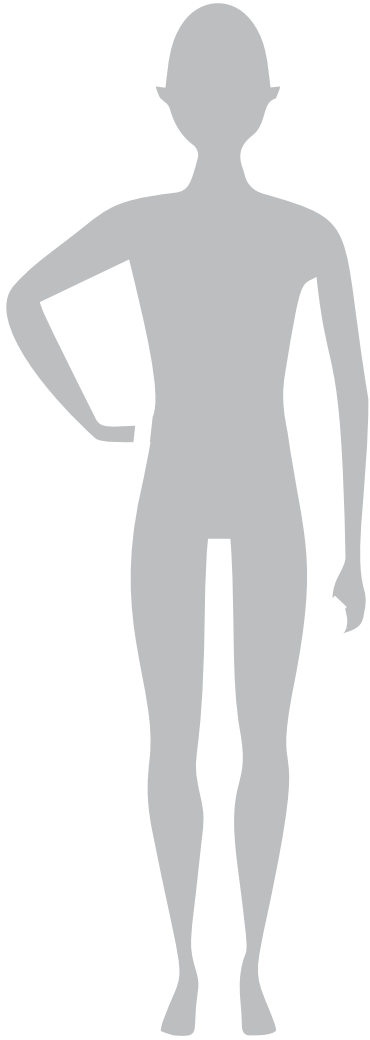

It consists of an outer ring of very very large vertical stones - weighing 25 tons each, 13 feet high and 7 feet tall, and all used to be connected by stones laying across the top. Stonehenge is a masterpiece of engineering, and building it would have taken huge effort from hundreds of well-organized people using only simple tools and technologies.

## MATERIALS NEEDED:

- poster paper 14"x22"
- glue / tape
- craft paper for decorations
- printed photos
- scissors
- anything else you want!

## INSTRUCTIONS:

Pick a country you want to visit, and research these 6 things:

1. It's independence day (if it has one) and other historical notes,
2. Foods it's known for
3. Natural landmarks it might be known for (does it have water in or around it, rivers, volcano, islands, etc,)
4. Man-Made landmarks it's known for - old buildings, giant dams, etc,
5. Economy - how does it make money/sustain its people, what does it use for money?
6. Language/Dress - what is the language most spoken, and what have people worn in the past, and what to do they wear now?

Now design your poster into 6 sections - one for each of those things you researched above, and fill each section with photos, drawings, or words that you think belong in that area.

- What do you think it would be like to live there for a whole month?

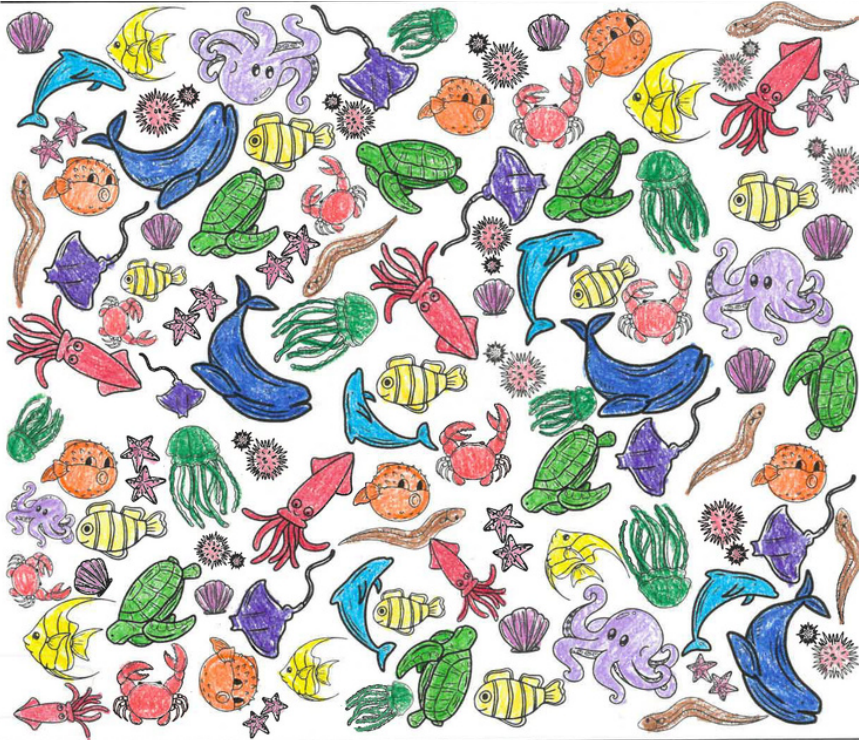









