So what do we do when our kids are worried? As usual, my favorite resource, PBS Kids, has a great article on it: https://www.pbs.org/parents/thrive/4-things-to-do-when-your-child-is-worried. Chiefly, you should name the feeling, explain and explore the feeling, find the source, and manage the worry. Managing the worry is always my hardest part. I can barely do it myself.

It's always a good reminder for me though, when my child is worrisome; it means she's stuck far too much in the future. We need more fun, more play, more exercise and more breathing. We need some grounding in the present. Which always has a way of reminding us somehow, that the future will be okay.





Notice of Leaders Association By-Laws Amendment

The Leader's Association needs to make a change to its By-Laws - which is called an Amendment. In order to do this, all 4-H membership aged 14 and older need to be notified of this suggested change and have the opportunity to present themselves and vote on the change. For your reference, you can find a copy of the current By-Laws here: https://tinyurl.com/LaX4HByLaws.

We would like to add two clauses to two sections (noted in italics).

One to Article IV Section 4, following "No member may serve more than two consecutive full terms a member of the Association Board" unless appointed to the position to fulfill a vacancy, see Article IV Section 7.

One to Article IV, Section 7, following the Term qualifications for the Board: Following an open election, if a vacancy remains of any Board position, the senior most filled position can make an appointment by majority approval from the Board.

Also, in our By-Laws Article VII it states if we want to make Amendments to the By-Laws, we need to give at least 21 days' notice. This announcement in the Cloverline is just that.

You are welcome to vote on this Amendment at the Thursday, October 12, 2023 meeting, 7:00 pm, at Hamilton Town Hall (N5105 Leonard St N, West Salem). FOR YOUR VOTE TO COUNT, you need to be a registered 4-H member. Complete your re-enrollment!

Annual Training Reminder

All adult volunteers are required to complete one refresher training each year of Title IX reporting policies. This training has been adapted to be more directly applied to your role and is 10 minutes long. Online at your time or available as a printed document. Links will be provided when the training is ready. You might think you don't need this information, until you do. Starting with your 2023-2024 re-enrollment, you'll be required to complete this for certification.

2023 Charters Due

A 4-H charter indicates the club or group is organized in accordance with the objectives of the 4-H program. It authorizes the club or group to use the 4-H emblem for educational purposes in accordance with laws and regulations established by Congress and the U.S. Department of Agriculture. The purpose of the 4-H Charter is education, communication, and accountability.

4-H clubs and groups must renew their charter annually through completion of the Charter Application Process. Charter Applications are to be completed online by November 1st.

4-H Thriving Model – Program Quality Scores La Crosse County – 2021-2022 Year

The 4-H Thriving Model predicts that youth who participate in 4-H programs that provide a high-quality developmental context will thrive, and thriving youth achieve key developmental outcomes. To determine scores for Program Quality, youth members aged 13 and up were invited to take an online survey asking them questions about their 4-H experience. Our La Crosse youth had an excellent survey sample last year (29%), one of the highest return rates in the state! After analyzing data, the scores are provided which assess each component of the model on a scale of 1-7, 7 meaning outstanding program quality.

Youth Sparks

The Youth Sparks outcome measures how 4-H programs give youth opportunities to explore topics they are interested in learning about, passionate about, engaged with.

Challenging Growth

Challenging Growth outcome measures the extent to which adults in the program help youth to see new possibilities, push them to reach higher and hold them accountable.

5.6

Youth Belonging

This outcome measures how safe, welcome and supported youth feel in 4-H programs

5.7

Youth-Adult Partnerships

This outcome measures how youth feel about adult volunteers working with them and if they feel respected, listened to and have their ideas taken seriously.

Caring Adults

This outcome measures how youth feel the adults in their 4-H programs care about them and investing time in youth.

Implications:

The data suggests that the program quality in Door County 4-H moderately good, and there is room to grow. The lower score for Youth Sparks is not surprising – Sparks are tied to the opportunities to learn new things (projects) and develop an interest in a topic/project. In 2022-2023, we surveyed all our families to find those sparks, and have been working on ways to offer more project-based learning for members, like the Foods Workshop. All of our qualities took a dip, which is expected when we have a larger survey sample (it gives us more accurate results). Watch for more specific opportunities to get involved and workshops to enhance life skills and interests! I'm excited to see the 2022-2023 results in March!
