Parents Welcome!!

You will see some of our Clover College classes are welcome for Adults to attend with the kids, and in most cases, instructors welcome the additional supervision an adult can bring. We do have a class for New Families though! Please check out 4-H 101 if you have questions about 4-H or just want to know more.

In the classes of Sewing and Woodworking - an adult to accompany the kids is a requirement. This is one of those days where adults learn almost as much of the kids so make it a bonding activity with your youth! In all cases where adults are required, no additional fee is needed for the adult. Most of the classes that allow adults as well are free. However for the Kids Canvas class, please inform us if you are attending as well so we can plan ahead for space.

Do your Demonstrations at Clover College this year!

Demonstrations are an excellent way for youth to gain practice in public speaking. Every year, we hold a pre-fair judging opportunity for youth to exhibit their demonstrations. In the fair book, these are listed in Dept 31. To ensure a live audience for youth to present their exhibit, we're holding Demonstration judging during the lunch period of our Clover College event on Feb. 10th. Here are the entry options youth can choose:

- Demonstration: Teaching someone how to do something on any subject. Presentation must consist of an introduction, body, conclusion, and questions from the audience.
- Illustrated Talk: Show and tell the audience your knowledge about something. Visuals and charts are encouraged, including, but not limited to maps, charts, posters, graphs, pictures, slides, or models to explain what the participant is saying.
- Action Center: An informal presentation to someone passing by about any subject, with an emphasis on showing. Individual presenter or groups of 2-4 carry on conversations with people passing through. Handouts may be used, posters or pictures may be used, and passerby interact with the presentation. A good example of an Action Center presentation is a school science fair or a booth exhibit at an event.

If your 4-H member wants to give a demonstration at Clover College, please fill out this form: https://forms.gle/e1DtpCR9ZXqcWU6p9. These presentations are eligible for ribbons and premiums if they are also presented during fair week. Also, most youth who complete these demonstrations are considered for additional awards as well.
