On May 17th, Sheryl Smith, Linda Gillmeister and I drove to Stevens Point, WI with a load of material, sewing items, two wedding dresses and a woman's formal suit to deliver them to the Wisconsin/Nicaragua Partners of the Americas warehouse. We got a tour of the facility, helped other volunteers load boxes of donated items into Gaylords for shipment, attended their quarterly meeting and listened to a speaker who had spent the last 30 years serving the people of Nicaragua, Honduras and Ecuador as a teacher and advocate. Then we all shared lunch with other volunteers and got to better know one another.

Partners of the Americas was founded in 1964 and is the 'people to people component of President John F. Kennedy's Alliance for Progress, a program of governmental cooperation in the Western Hemisphere. It plays a vital role in making humanitarian efforts possible.'*

WAHCE has had a close working relationship with W/NP for many years, providing material and sewing machines to Sewing Centers so women in the villages can support themselves and their families by making doll clothing and other beautifully sewn articles which are then sold. It is called the Chica Nica Project.

WAHCE also provides educational materials for the Learning Centers. 'Each Learning Center is autonomous with organization and management by the women of the communities. Class subjects are in response to requests from community members. Classes are designed to include skill-building, personal dignity and self-sufficiency, with a focus on employment for rural women.'* W/NP recently expanded its reach to Ghana in Africa by collecting used bicycles and bicycle parts. Pallets of bicycles were at the Stevens Point warehouse ready for shipment when we were there. It was an amazing day!

Laura Ira, our LAHCE Cultural Arts Chair, and her sister, Bev, are planning a move to Arizona. Laura sold her home as soon as she put a sign in her yard, so it has been a busy, busy time for them packing up and looking for a new home in Arizona. We will miss you so much! She served as ACWW President from 1947 - 1953. The UN Zero Hunger Project was sponsored by CWC. A project to teach women on organic farming and gave them the seeds that was adaptable to their area.

NVON-This is a USA Organization. Started in 1994, has over 31,000 members in 9 states.

Their impact is education and workshops. They do 3 year projects such as our recent Pollinators Feed the World. Others have been-Water Around the World, raising funds to help supply water filters to those in need. Clothe a Child, sent clothing, school supplies and other necessities to Indian Reservations. Dare to be Healthy-education on women's health in communities, states, and the world.

Destination: Norskedalen Nature and Heritage Center


