#### INTERNATIONAL REPORT

The last part of International is our WAHCE-Wisconsin Association for Home and Community Education. In July newsletter, Cathy covered very nicely Wisconsin Partnership with Nicaragua project. Besides the Learning Centers there, drilling of wells and using water filters continues. There are nurses also that donate their time and knowledge to show them better ways for healthy living that go there from Wisconsin.

WAHCE also supports VIP-Ventures in People in Haiti. Projects there are-sponsor 6 scholarships a year to further someone's education, sponsor an English teacher to help student succeed in a global society, distribute water filters, started 4-H clubs to teach young people skills (membership now over 2000 for ages 9-17. They also teach skills to raised goats, to give them income plus to have milk and meat.

Days for Girls, another WAHCE project. It was started in 2008 to make kits of menstrual hygiene products so girls in third world countries could stay in school during their periods. The goal was 6000 kits in 2022. Holmen has a chapter which I belong to. Our goals is 50 kits a year.

# Extension Office Support



As we prepare for the preserving season by gathering ingredients, please remember the importance of always checking that the acidity level of vinegar is 5%. The acid from vinegar helps to ensure the safety of your home canned products.

The National Center for Home Food Preservation has issued the following guidance if you have used vinegar with lower acidity (less than 5%) in your canned food products and you followed a validated recipe:

- If your canned food has been preserved for less than 24 hours using 4% vinegar, store the jars in the refrigerator to maintain the safety and quality of the product.
- If your canned food has been preserved for more than 24 hours using 4% vinegar, discard the product.
