Beyond youth, our desired outcomes go a lot farther when we tend to meet people where they are anyway.

What I mean by myself over-accommodating is that I'm very good at avoiding uncomfortable things. Very very good. And in the process of avoiding things like touch and... well... people, to conserve my energy, I've come to realize that I'm missing out on a few things, too.

This morning, I had to tell my kids we're doing something hard today. And in the emotional dysregulation, I held one of them for 20 minutes to calm down. Everyone left content for the day. Would you believe I'm having the best day ever? And I think it was just from that hug.

Huh.
