



Have you ever seen the words "hearing" and "listening"? They may seem like the same thing, but they are different. Hearing is using one of your five senses to pick up sounds. Listening is when you think about those sounds and understand what someone is saying. An important part of being a good communicator is not just being able to hear, but to be able to listen. Try the exercise below to see how well you listen!

WHAT YOU'LL NEED:

 A red, orange, yellow, green, blue, purple, brown, and black coloring utensil.

WHAT TO DO:

- Have someone read you each direction below about The Shopping Trip.
- Follow the directions by listening to what the person is telling you do.
- Check your picture and see how you did!

THE SNOWPERSON BUILD

- 1. Color the large tree, and small tree, in the background GREEN.
- 2. Color the snowperson's nose ORANGE, scarf RED, and hat BLACK.
- 3. Color the pom of the hat on the taller child PURPLE, and the rest of the hat BLUE.
- 4. Color the pants on both children BLACK, color the stripe on the smaller child's pants GREEN, and then color both children's boots BLUE.
- 5. On the shorter child, color their hat PURPLE, and mittens BLUE.
- 6. On the shorter child, color their jacket PINK and their scarf ORANGE.
- 7. On the taller child, color their mittens YELLOW, and their belt BLACK, and their jacket ORANGE.
- 8. Color the scarf on the taller child RED.
- 9. Color both children's hair BROWN.
- 10. Color the stem of the trees, and the snowperson's stick arms BROWN.
- 11. Color the snowperson's eyes and smile BLACK.
- 12. In the upper right hand corner write which month it is.

SYMMETRICAL SNOWFLAKES

That means that if you cut a snowflake in half, each half are perfect mirrors of each other. Practice your skills by creating symmetrical snowflakes below!

MATERIALS:

- Blue construction paper
- Glue
- Scissors
- Q-tips




INSTRUCTIONS:

- 1. Cut circles out of the blue construction paper.
- 2. Design your snowflake by breaking/cutting your Q-tips into various sizes to give your snowflake a more intricate design.
- 3. While designing see if you can make your snowflake symmetrical.
- 4. Once you have your Q-tips where you want them, you can glue them into place.
