Nacho Maker Duties



The primary responsibility of the Nacho Maker is to make delicious nachos. Here is more information to help you do just that!

- At the start of your shift, check in with the day chair on the west side of the food stand. Put on a nametag, a white apron, and a hair net (or wear a hat).
- Wash your hands and put on gloves.
- The nacho maker sits in the aisle between each food stand, along with the slushy maker. You will get orders from both sides.

Making the nachos:

- There are two different types of nachos to assemble:
 - Nachos (chips and cheese)
 - Macho Nachos (meat, chips and cheese)
- At your station, you'll have all the materials you need: cups for cheese, bags of chips, crock of meat, and nacho clam box.
- Nachos: Put cheese in a serving cup, put cup and bag of chips in nacho clam box.
- Macho Nachos: Open bag of chips, put in nacho clam box, one scoop of taco meat onto chips, along with salsa, shredded cheese onto chips, add a sour cream packet.
- When your shift is done, you get a coupon for a free beverage from the Food Stand. Put your apron back on the hook outside, hand it to the next operator, or put it in the laundry hamper if it's dirty. Grab your personal items from the cupboard and thank you for donating your time and talents to help us have a successful Fair!
